KELLY M. GREENHILL is the Director of Seminar XXI; a faculty member at Tufts University and at MIT; and a Senior Research Fellow at MIT and at the Niskanen Center. Greenhill has thus far published four books, including the award-winning *Weapons of Mass Migration: Forced Displacement, Coercion, and Foreign Policy* (2nd edition forthcoming). Greenhill is currently revising another book project, which explores the influence of rumors, conspiracy theories and other forms of “extra-factual” information on foreign and defense policy formulation and implementation. Greenhill is also architect and co-creator of the “Geopolitics of Forced Migration” dataset project. Outside of academia, she has consulted for the UN, UNHCR, NATO, the World Bank and other international organizations.

CHAPPELL LAWSON is an Associate Professor of Political Science at MIT. Lawson’s recent work has focused on homeland security policy, Mexican politics, the effect of candidates’ physical appearance on their electoral success, and political leadership. From September 2009 through February 2011, Lawson served in government as Executive Director and Senior Advisor to the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Lawson was a National Fellow at The Hoover Institution, Stanford University, and a Visiting Research Fellow at the Center for U.S.-Mexico Studies at the University of California, San Diego. His recent publications include *Beyond 9/11: Homeland Security for the 21st Century* and *Mexico’s Democratic Evolution: A Comparative Study of the 2012 Elections*.

ANDREW SELEE is President of the Migration Policy Institute (MPI), a global nonpartisan institution that seeks to improve immigration and integration policies through fact-based research, opportunities for learning and dialogue, and the development of new ideas to address complex policy questions. Selee’s research focuses on migration globally, with a special emphasis on immigration policies in the United States, Latin America, and the Caribbean. He is the author of several books, including, most recently, *Vanishing Frontiers: The Forces Driving Mexico and the United States Together* and *What Should Think Tanks Do? A Strategic Guide to Policy Impact*. He has published opinion articles in *Foreign Affairs*, *Foreign Policy*, and *Americas Quarterly*, and he contributes a regular column to Mexico’s largest newspaper, *El Universal*.
